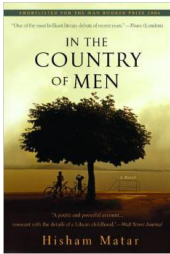

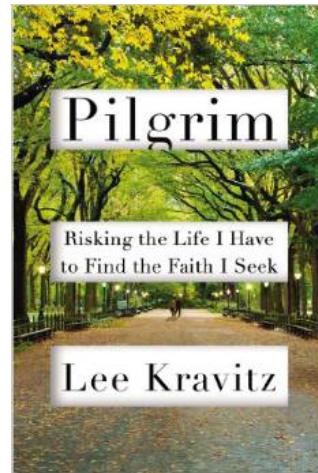

Free Music, Movies, eBooks, and Language Learning

The North Dakota State Library has launched the Freegal suite - a subscription to Freegal Music, Freegal Movies, Freading, and Rocket Languages. Library patrons can now download or stream everyone from Carrie Underwood or One Direction to Mozart! **Freegal Music** allows patrons to download up to 5 songs and stream up to 3 hours of music per week. **Freegal Movies** allows up to 3 movies or TV shows per week. **Freading** allows patrons to download up to 6 tokens worth of eBooks per week (each eBook has a different token value). Learn a new language with **Rocket Languages** - choose from 11 languages. Be sure to have your West Fargo Public Library card handy when accessing these online resources. Need help getting started?
