The West Fargo Public Library announces free online and mobile access to thousands of streaming movies, music, audiobooks, and ebooks through its new partnership with hoopla digital. This service will allow West Fargo library card-holders to instantly check out and enjoy dynamic content on their smartphones, tablets, and computers. Through the library's website, www.westfargolibary.org, patrons can access hoopla digital on their personal computer or download the free hoopla app to check out items on their mobile device.

Children's tablets are coming to the library!

The library now has five children's tablets available for checkout! Each tablet is pre-loaded with activities geared toward ages 3-5, 5-7, or toward children with developmental disabilities. Activities focus on either STEAM or English Language Arts. Tablets may be checked out by adults with a library card in good standing.
