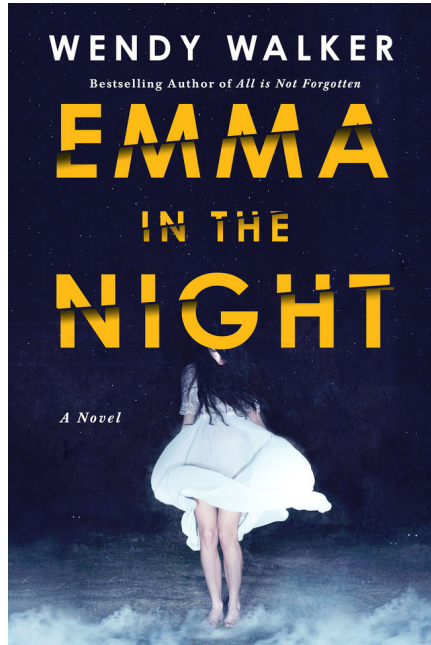


Reader's Corner

TutorND

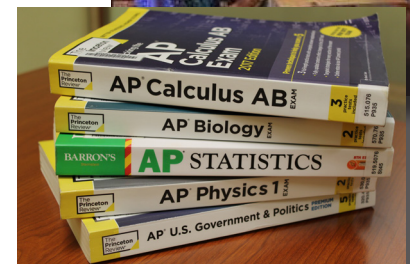

Visit this display of materials from the ND State Historical Society on the Fort Lincoln Internment Camp located in Bismarck, ND.

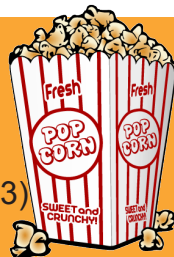

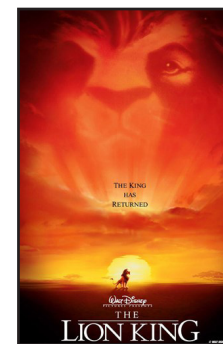
